Have Your Say on Walking and Cycling Improvements in Sawbridgeworth!

Hertfordshire County Council and East Hertfordshire District Council are working on a plan to make walking and cycling safer and easier. It's called the East Herts Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan (LCWIP).

In summer 2024, we asked for your views — and thanks to your feedback, the plan has now been updated. We're inviting you to look at the final proposals and let us know what you think.

What's proposed in the plan?

- New cycle paths
- Safer crossings
- Improved junctions
- Wider, smoother pavements
- Measures to slow down traffic
