Did you know...

Between Mrs Jones, Miss King, Mrs Sarjeant and Mrs Abbott, we have visited all of the settings who have children joining us in September.

The new families joining us whose children are in receipt of additional support (SEN, Medical, Pupil Premium) have already had the opportunity for a 1:1 meeting with Mrs Jones, to ensure we have all of our amazing provision in place for September from Day 1.

In June, Mrs Jones had face to face meetings with over 35 families to ensure that the Medical Care Plans we have in place are the very best they can be.

The children in Year 2 spent the morning at F&B being taught by their Year 3 teachers!

All Year 2 children spent the morning at Reedings watching the Year 6 leavers show and learning about transition and change in a different way.

We have already met with many different professional services who are offering support for pupils in our school in September—this is before the children have even joined us!.

Before the county wide transition day, the children in Year 2 will have had an additional 5 opportunities this month alone to visit

Reedings and become familiar with the site.
