Home Learning Tasks

<u>Mental Maths challenges:</u> At home you can help your child by practising counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. When we start looking at times tables we stop at 12x2, 12x5 and 12x10 so when you practise counting in 2s you can stop at 24 but if your child can carry on it's even better!

<u>Topic at home:</u> This half term we have a DT challenge! **Build a model castle using construction toys or found and recycled materials.** NB: Whilst your child will benefit from your input and help, please allow your child to practise important skills such as cutting and joining techniques. We would love to receive photos of the castles once they are done, they can be emailed to our email addresses, which you can find at the top of this newsletter. Your child will get time to tell the rest of the class about their model/castle soon after we've received the photo(s). During the last week of half term all the castles will be on display for our end of topic celebration.
