Literacy: We will be playing 'I Spy' using different objects and saying the initial sounds for them. For example, "I spy with my little eye something beginning with mmm" and then the object might be a toy mouse. **Maths:** We will practice counting but saying one number for each object we touch.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development: We will be learning about what is safe to go into our bodies and things we should never put in our mouths.

Understanding of the World: We will be learning about the names for different body parts and labelling one of our friends.

Physical Development: We will be working on our fine motor skills by wrapping a paper 'mummy' up with white string



Communication and Language: Our role-play area will be changing into a spooky witch's cottage where the children can make potions with spiders, eyeballs and frogs!

Choose a Challenge:

These activities are only suggestions, feel free to do as many or as few as you like (there is no obligation to do any).

Literacy: Play initial sound 'I Spy' with your child to help them to recognise the first sound in words. You can use objects around you or a picture:

I Spy with My Little Eye



Maths: Help your child to count their toys – how many teddies/ dollies/ cars do they have?



Physical development: Do some activities with your child to support their fine motor skills. Things like building with Lego or Duplo, threading beads, and playing with playdough can help with this, as well as wrapping string (like we are doing to make our Halloween mummies) and tracing over lines with a pencil.
