What we have been up to this week...

We have started our new topic 'Why do Leaves go Crispy?' which explores the season of autumn. The children have used pumpkins and autumnal pictures to order by size, painted fireworks for bonfire night and dressed the teddy bears for the colder weather. What we will be doing next week...

Literacy: We will begin to learn about rhyming by reading 'Fox's Socks' and pointing out the rhymes. We will then have a rhyme matching game for the children to play independently.

Maths: We will practice counting to 10 and look at the written numerals for these numbers.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development: We will continue to reinforce who the children can talk to if they have a worry at school.

Understanding of the World: We will be visiting the conservation area for our memorable experience (weather permitting) on Friday morning. Please ensure your child has wellies and a warm coat (which may get muddy). **Expressive arts and design:** The children will have the choice to make a poppy picture for remembrance – which we will also learn about.


Communication and Language: We will discuss which animals live in a woodland and we will be discussing things we find in autumn and where these come from.

Choose a Challenge:

These activities are only suggestions, feel free to do as many or as few as you like (there is no obligation to do any).

Literacy: Read rhyming stories with your child – can they point out the rhymes? Here are some of my suggestions, however most books for children this age have rhymes in:

Maths: Sing counting songs to 10. Set up ten objects/toys and encourage your child to count them.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development: Talk to your child about who they can tell if they feel worried or upset. Reinforce the importance of telling someone they trust so that they can help them.
