What we will be doing next week...

Literacy: We will start to develop story retelling skills through using small world figures to re-tell class favourite 'The Gruffalo'

Maths: We will be saying some number formation rhymes for numbers 1-3 to help us to write these numbers.

- 1: Straight line down and then you're done, that's how you make a number one.
- 2: Half a heart will never do slide to the right and make a two.
- 3: Around the tree, around the tree, that's the way to make a three

Expressive Arts and Design: We will continue to learn the songs for the Christmas play.

Understanding of the World: Next week is geography week, where each class explores a different country. In Hedgehog class we will be learning about Norway! The children will look at photos of Norway, the flag and learn about the stories of the trolls that are told there.

Personal, social and emotional development:

Linking back to our discussion about being a good friend from this week, we will be talking about respecting and listening to our friends.

Communication and Language: We will be discussing nocturnal and diurnal animals and linking this back to woodland animals.

Choose a Challenge:

Literacy: Help your child to re-tell Maths: Practice number formation with **Understanding the World:** Talk to your your child. Write numbers 1-3 in child about how there are lots of familiar stories using toys or the pictures in the book. highlighter for them to trace and say the different countries in the world. Has rhymes on the previous page to support your child ever been to another country? them to trace these.
