WOW and thank you! Thank you to everyone who was able to donate in terms of money, effort and time for making cakes and for their donations to help make this year fantastic.



Keeping Children Safe Online!

NSPCC

We know the importance of keeping children safe online but equally know that pupils can often know more then adults.

We have secured two dates where the NSPCC will be presenting via Zoom an

online session to help share some idea, tips and guidance. This is to enhance the summer terms offer of the Two Johns. The Two sessions can be accessed by clicking on the below dates. They shall be sent to everyone the morning of the event so that you can find it easily.

- Monday 27 November 7-8pm
- Wednesday 6 December 6-7pm

Some facts to share which shows that if devices are not protected and adults aware of how they are being used allows the potential of risk to seep into the child's life:

- 17% per 3-4 year olds have their own or free access to a mobile. Of them a quarter of threeto-four-year-olds who have their own mobile phone use WhatsApp
- Children aged three to seven typically use WhatsApp and FaceTime for sending messages or making calls
- The majority of eight-to-eleven-year-olds have profiles on TikTok, followed by WhatsApp, YouTube and Snapchat. All of which are apps with user age ratings of 13 or 16 in the case of WhatsApp.
- By 11 to 12 years old, 97 per cent of children have their own social media profile, with almost universal rates of mobile phone ownership as children transition to secondary school.
