Maths challenges: the children can practise rounding to the nearest 10 on Topmarks:

www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/rocket-rounding Start with the first game: up to 99 to the nearest 10. If your child is confident at this level, they can be challenged with the next level up: up to 999 to the nearest 10. The number line with each rocket makes rounding to the nearest 10 very clear to the children. Please support your child where needed.

1. Build a den and read your book inside it.
2. Wrap on warm and read a book outside!
3. Read a book to your brother, sister, cat, dog, friend or teddy.
