What we have been up to this week...

Montessori:

Here I will be showing the Montessori learning the children have been doing. This week, we used the sandpaper numbers to support the children's knowledge of the shape of the numbers and putting them in order.

What we will be doing next week...

Literacy: We will be thinking about the initial sounds in words. We will also continue to encourage the children to write their names using their name template.

Maths: We will continue to learn about 2D shapes and thinking about the shape of everyday objects, such as doors, the clock in the classroom etc.
