<u>Maths challenges:</u> there is a lovely teaching clock on: https://www.topmarks.co.uk/time/teaching-clock Please use this to talk about time with your child. Start by general time vocabulary: time, clock, hour hand/minute hand, minute, hour, second before moving on to telling the time: o'clock first, half past, quarter past and quarter too after. You don't need to do all, go with what your child is comfortable with.

<u>PSHE:</u> talk about acts of kindness and what they do to both parties (the giver and the receiver). Maybe you want to think of an act of kindness your family can do as part of the festive season?
