Focus on Oracy: Poetry and rhymes

Learning poetry is something we are focussing on this year at F&B. Through enjoying rhymes, poems and songs, and reciting poems or parts of longer poems together as a class, we can build children's strong emotional connection to language. The predictability of rhymes in poems and songs also helps children to memorise and re-use newly acquired words and phrases.

It has been lovely that so many of the children have been so enthusiastic about learning and reciting the poems each fortnight. I can't walk around the school without a child stopping me to recite what they've learnt it's been delightful! This fortnight's poem is more of a challenge but I'm sure the children will rise to it!
