What we have been up to this week...

Montessori:

The children really enjoy using the Montessori Shape Insets. This is great for fine motor skills and as an early writing activity.

What we will be doing next week...

Literacy: The children will start to be introduced to the Read Write Inc picture cards which will help them with letter recognition when we start learning the letters.

Maths: The children will be learning about numbers beyond 5 and will learn how to form numbers 1-9.

Physical development: The children will continue to learn gymnastics poses/shapes in PE.

Understanding of the World: We will be discussing the animals who live in the arctic, such as polar bears.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

In our SCARF session we will be discussing how we can keep ourselves healthy, through what we eat, drinking water, exercising and getting enough sleep. We will also be discussing the people who help us, such as doctors, firefighters and police officers.

Communication and Language: We will continue to sing songs relating to our topic as well as counting songs. Nursery rhymes are a great early introduction to reading.

Choose a Challenge:

These activities are only suggestions, feel free to do as many or as few as you like (there is no obligation to do any).

Literacy: Practice oral blending with your Maths: Sing number songs with your **Understanding of the World:** Discuss child. Can your child say how many come child by spelling out 3 letter words some of the animals who live in the (saying the sound for each letter) and next? arctic – do they live on land or in water? encouraging your child to put the sounds What do they eat? together and decode the word, for example "b-e-d".
