Squirrels and Koala class had a very special visitor visit them this week. A real life pilot called Mr Brooker came in and all the children were surprised to learn that he was Mrs Brookers husband! Mr Brooker told the children all about planes.

We had some fun trying to spot where the landing runway was in Austria and in Egypt. The Egypt runway was covered in sand and the Austrian one had a river and mountains either side which made

them tricky to spot. Some of the children have very eagle eyes though and managed to spot them! We also listened to some of the warning sounds it makes if the airplane is not ready to

fly, Mr Brooker said he had never heard any of these sounds in real life though on the plane — which is very reassuring!

The children had some fantastic questions to ask Mr Brooker, such as why the plane doesn't go straight up in the sky and how fast do the planes go? We learnt that the furthest Mr Brooker has flown is to Thailand! Squirrel and Koala Class loved this experience, thank you very much to Mr Brooker for coming in to see us!

Name: Role: How long have you been a governor?	Andrew Dongworth Maths Lead Governor and member of Resources Committee Since October 2022						
When were you last in the school and what were you doing?	I visit the school regularly as a parent of a child in Reception, but my most recent visit in connection with my role as a governor was on 8 November to meet with the Maths lead teacher in order to review the progress being made in that subject across Key Stage 1 classes.						
What did you learn during your visit?	The school's commitment to the effective teaching of maths is evident from the enthusiasm shown by all pupils in all aspects of their learning, whether it be working in pairs to discuss ideas, working in groups or problem solving at their tables. The teachers are confident in presenting the lessons in ways which engage the children and allow them to make progress at their own pace and in the ways which work best for each individual.						
What challenges do you see for the future?	A clear priority of the school is to address any challenges which arise from the desire to ensure a smooth transition for children from the Mor tessori led approach in early years classes as they move into key stage 1.						
When is your next visit to the school?	I will be carrying out another Maths monitoring visit later in the Spring term, when I hope to look at the Montessori teaching of maths in the early years classes.

Focus on Oracy: Poetry and rhymes

Learning poetry is something we are focussing on this year at F&B. Through enjoying rhymes, poems and songs, and reciting poems or parts of longer poems together as a class, we can build children's strong emotional connection to language. The predictability of rhymes in poems and songs also helps children to memorise and re-use newly acquired words and phrases.

It has been lovely that so many of the children have been so enthusiastic about learning and reciting the poems each fortnight. I can't walk around the school without a child stopping me to recite what they've learnt—it's been delightful! This fortnight's poem has been chosen once again by our English Link Governor, Zoe Russell:
