What we have been up to this week...

Montessori: Every month, the colour of the activities on the finger strong and practical life shelves changes. February is pink for valentine's day. We have pouring, spooning, and tweezering on the practical life shelf. The finger strong shelf then has a pink car with some wiggly pink lines for the children to follow, threading, Polly Pocket dolls to dress, lacing and squishy stress balls to build up hand strength.









What we will be doing next week...

Literacy: The children will be introduced to the picture cards for the sounds n,p,g,o,c,k.


Maths: The children will revisit their learning on shapes and learn about some more complex shapes such as diamonds, ovals, pentagons and hexagons. They will also be using shapes to make pictures. **Expressive Arts and Design:** The children will continue their music learning with a bouncy music and movement activity.

Understanding of the World: The children will be learning about Chinese New Year and how this is celebrated. They will have the chance to make their own Chinese lantern and colour some dragons!
