What we have been up to this week...

Montessori: March's colour for finger strong and practical life is yellow. We have some easter-themed fine motor activities.



Thursday was world book day! The children all had some amazing outfits! We themed our learning this week on 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' which fits in nicely with our topic. Our ducklings also hatched, they are adorable!



What we will be doing next week...

Literacy: The children will recap the picture cards as we have now introduced them all!

Maths: The children will be learning about the composition of numbers up to ten.

Expressive Arts and Design: The children will have a try at drawing the ducklings from observation.

Understanding of the World: The children will learn about the signs of spring and some of the names of spring flowers.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:
The children will learn about caring for living things and that we must be gentle with our ducklings.

Communication and Language: We will be discussing prepositions (on, under, in front, behind, next to) of a hen on a farm (such as "the hen is behind the fence")

Choose a Challenge:

These activities are only suggestions, feel free to do as many or as few as you like (there is no obligation to do any).

Literacy: Play initial sound 'I spy' with your child. Can they find and bring you objects that begin with a given sound? Such as "can you find me something that starts with 'a'?", your child might bring you an apple.

Maths: Practice number recognition for numbers 6-10 with your child.

Understanding of the World: Talk to your child about the ducklings – how did they go from being an egg to being a duckling? Will they stay this small?
