What we have been up to this week...

Red Nose Day: The children enjoyed wearing non-uniform and decorating superhero masks for Red Nose Day. They also had a special visitor in assembly!

What we will be doing next week...

Literacy: The children will begin learning each individual sound in more depth. This week they will learn m,a,s,d and t

Maths: The children will be exploring splitting quantities into two groups

Expressive Arts and Design: The children will have the opportunity to paint their own pond with frogs, make a spring blossom tree and make a paper frog.

Understanding of the World: The children will learn about the life-cycle of a frog. They will have a messy play opportunity with chia seeds mixed with water, as this looks like frogspawn

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:
The children will be learning the ways to be more independent and will be given challenges throughout the day, such as taking off their own jumper or zipping up their own coat.

Communication and Language: We will be discussing celebrations and how Christians celebrate Easter

Choose a Challenge:

These activities are only suggestions, feel free to do as many or as few as you like (there is no obligation to do any).

Literacy: Can your child say the sound for each letter in their name?

Maths: Play games with your child where they sort quantities into two groups, such as sharing sweets between two teddies – are the groups equal?

Personal, Social and Emotional Development: Encourage your child to be independent, such as putting their own jumper on and taking it off themselves, putting their own pyjamas on at bedtime, doing their own buttons of zips on coats etc.
