What we have been up to this week...

Montessori: This week I would like to share the Montessori Number Rods with you. This builds on from the Red Rods and encourages the child to not only order the rods by length, but also to add quantity to number as each stripe is worth one. They then match the numerals to the correct rods.



This week the children have learned about the life-cycle of a frog, made beautiful Easter cards and had a fun science workshop!



What we will be doing next week...

Literacy: The children will be learning the sounds t, i, n, and p

Maths: The children will begin to learn about number bonds with the Numberblocks

Expressive Arts and Design: The children will be icing their own Easter biscuit. Please refer to the email about this.

Understanding of the World: The children will learn about Easter and how this is celebrated by Christians.

Physical development: We will continue to work on independence and encouraging the children to put on/take off their own jumpers and cardigans.

Communication and Language: We will be discussing the life-cycle of a flower

Choose a Challenge:
