- To help your child learn how to tell the time, this interactive clock is a very useful tool that we also use in class: https://www.topmarks.co.uk/time/teaching-clock Remember to do this step by step: o'clock, then half past. If this is secure, you can move on to quarter past (easier) and quarter to (harder). After this, you can move on to 5 minute intervals. The children should know how to count and 5s and use this to help them!
